Thyme in the Kitchen



This is a dish I served at one of my feasts several years ago. With the approaching harvest I thought I would submit a few recipes that would enable you to use some of that produce. The recipe is from a cookbook dating from the 1340's -- *Das buch von gutter spise*.



Krapfen

- 4 apples, peeled and diced (about 2 cups) (used Granny Smith)
- 2 cups walnuts
- ½ cup honey
- 1 ½ tsp ground cinnamon
- ½ tsp ground nutmeg
- ½ tsp ground mace
- 1/4 tsp ground cloves
- 1 deep dish pie crust (made of flour, butter, water and salt)

Cooking directions:


Cook the apples in the honey until they are starting to become soft. (this takes approximately 10 minutes.) Mix the cooled apples and honey with the walnuts and spices. Roll out pie crust and put in pan. Fill crust with mixture. Cook in the oven at 350* F until crust is brown (approximately 30 minutes).

The Loch Salann guild met at THL Vogg's castle with Casamira and Hilde preparing the menu.

In a Cook's Guild Meeting that would have made Mistress Constance proud, we used fish caught by Dame Hilde, and anything green in Casamira's garden to make a delicious repast.

Hilde's tiny cleaned trout were stuffed with various herbs and butter. Most used some green onion and thyme, but just' rosemary and only garlic were also tasty. Some were wrapped in aluminum foil and baked. Since they didn't have foil in period, Hilde made a salt dough (1/2 c salt to 2 c flour), rolled it thin, and wrapped an herbed fish inside the "coffin". Both tasted wonderful, however the skin of the fish from the coffin was very salty, and the coffin was not eaten.

Vogg made the apricot lentil soup – another version tried out for Coronation. Hilde mentioned a "weed" that was eaten in medieval times, and showed me the all too familiar plant. Purslane, (Portulaca oleracea) is low calorie, high fiber, green leafy vegetable with omega-3 fatty acids, vitamins A, C, some Bs. While St. Hildegard von Bingen, 1098-1179, well known for her herbalist writings, did not approve of this herb, other period authors cited purselane's use raw in salads and cooked in soups, or alone like spinach.

I pulled purslane from my garden, and from my lawn. I also cut anything green from my garden including chard, spinach, green onion tops, parsley tops, beet greens, sorrel, chives, parsley, mint and one or 2 unidentified greens. The greens were washed and used in both a green salad and a stir-fry. One unidentified green was easily identified because of its taste - radish greens with flowers. Apparently these are very pricy at the farmer's market.

All the greens were washed and cut, if needed. For the salad, I used just the purslane leaves, the above mentioned greens, some mushrooms, red onion and just a touch of mint. Tossed with vinegar and oil, with a dash of salt and pepper, it was a very good salad. Instead of buying fancy greens, substitute your garden weeds! The stir-fry started with red onion, garlic and mushrooms sautéed in olive oil and bacon grease. When these were softened, I added all of the greens listed above (except mint), and let them wilt. I used the purslane stems and leaves. Once wilted, the greens were removed from the pan. I can't say the purslane added a lot to either of these dishes. The flavors of the various greens with the onion and hint of bacon were great. I admit, my mundane family would not eat either of these dishes, but they don't eat salad or greens. So for you adventurous folks, try it. I bet you have some purslane growing in your yard.

We topped our meal off with a fresh raspberry and fig bread pudding with a touch of Casamira's special raspberry syrup. It was a great cook's guild with adventure and experimentation.
