


Greetings From the Seneschal:


At Kingdom Arts and Science Collegium:

A look at Heraldry in the Current Middle Ages

Selected definitions from:

GLOSSARY OF TERMS As Used By The College of Arms of the Society for Creative Anachronism, Inc.

<u>Arms</u> - In the SCA, people who have been awarded arms by the Crown of a kingdom may call their heraldic device "arms." The distinction between arms and a device is not tracked by the College of Arms.

<u>Badge</u> - A piece of armory used by an individual or group to identify possessions, retainers, members, or other items. A badge is different from a device, which is used solely by its owner (or the owner's herald).

Blazon - The verbal or written description of a piece of armory.

<u>Charge</u> - An item placed on a piece of armory. A charge may be directly on the field, overall, or entirely on another charge. A charge may be a simple geometric figure, such as a *fess* or a *roundel*, or a representation of an animate or inanimate item, such as a *lion* or a *sword*.

<u>Color</u> - In Society heraldry, the colors are *azure*, *gules*, *sable*, *purpure* and *vert*. The furs that use colors as underlying tinctures, such as *counter-ermine* and *pean*, are treated like colors for contrast. *See also* Metal, Tincture.

<u>Device</u> - A heraldic design that uniquely represents the person or group that owns it. A person who has not been awarded arms may register personal armory as a device. This device will become arms when the person receives an award, grant, or patent of arms. The distinction between arms and a device is not tracked by the College of Arms.

<u>Herald</u> - When used with a capital H, *Herald* is a title referring to a person at a particular level in the College of Arms. Used with a small h, a herald is a person who works regularly on some aspect of heraldry.

Metal - In Society heraldry, the metals are argent and Or. Furs that use metals as underlying tinctures, such as ermine and erminois, are treated as metals for contrast. Partition - A division of the field into pieces that have different tinctures. Some partitions follow and are named after ordinaries, like per pale, per fess, per bend, and per saltire; others have their own names, like checky, lozengy, and quarterly. Proper - (1) Specifying that a charge appears in its natural hues. A zebra proper has the zebra's characteristic pattern of black and white stripes; a tree proper has a brown trunk and green leaves. Proper should not be used to indicate colorings that can be easily described in terms of the usual heraldic tinctures: a raven proper is better blazoned as a raven sable. It should also be used only if a competent artist will be able to draw the animal correctly without extensive research. (2) Indicates a standard set of tinctures for a standard heraldic charge, such as a sword proper, which has an argent blade and Or hilt and quillons, or a rose proper, which is a rose gules, barbed vert and seeded Or. See Table 3, Conventional Proper Colorings for a listing of proper tinctures defined in precedent.

<u>Tincture</u> - One of the seven standard hues used in Society armory, or a fur. The tinctures are the colors *azure*, *gules*, *purpure*, *sable*, and *vert* and the metals *argent* and *Or*. Furs include the ermined furs and *vair*, *potent*, *scaly*, *papelonny*, and their variations.











Reserved Charges

Some charges are specifically reserved in the Society for use by particular groups or individuals, for instance the coronet with strawberry leaves reserved to Dukes and Duchesses, the circle of chain reserved to Knights, or the Laurel wreath reserved to Society branches.

Restricted Charges

Some charges are so closely associated with royal families or specific honors outside the Society that they may not be used in Society armory at all. Examples of these include *Azure semy-de-lys Or* used by France, a Chinese Dragon with five toes used only by Chinese Emperors, or a Tudor Rose. Others have acquired such negative connotations that their registration may cause offense to a significant portion of the population.

Feast will be prepared by Lord Darius Xerxes Al Rashid and will include many Middle Eastern delights. The menu will be posted on the Loch Salann website. Feast reservations are limited to the first 125 prepaid reservations. Off-board seating will be available – if you are interested, please contact the autocrats in advance so arrangements may be made. The site is the Zion Building at the Utah State Fairpark, located at 155 North 1000 West in Salt Lake City. Make your way to Interstate Highway 15. Take the 600 North off ramp (Exit 309) and turn West. Proceed to 1000 West and turn left. Continue south bound on 1000 West four blocks (about 7/10 mile) until you see the Fairpark on your right. Go through the gate and straight ahead. *Do not pay for parking – Parking has been PRE-PAID and is included in your site fee* if there is an attendant at the gate tell them you are with the SCA.

The site is damp and opens at 11am and closes at 10pm. No pets, except of course service animals, are permitted. Open flames including lit candles are not permitted in the hall (but their battery operated counterparts are welcome) Please prepare accordingly.

12th Night/Baronial Investiture

As the days slowly start to lengthen and we bid farewell to the holiday season, please join us in one last celebration of winter. A late period feast will be prepared be Lady Fiametta in the style of King Henery VIII's yule feast. We will also be trying something new at this event for the children. We will be holding a Feast for Children. Children will learn feast etiquette from table setting to table protocol.

Site fee will include a soup and bread lunch buffet from 11:00 to 1:30.

A new A&S champion shall be chosen at this event based on both the recommendations from the outgoing Baron and Baroness and the observations of the upcoming Baron and Baroness. To this end there will be an A&S display. It is asked that each entrant provide minimal documentation for the entry, and all entries shall be welcome.



The time has come to brush up on your Italian Renaissance dances as Lady Maysun will be hosting a Ball in honor of our new Baron and Baroness.

Supplies: 63 sheets of card stock (some in heraldic colors) the rest can be white.

1 pair of very large dice tape (masking tape works best) basket of prizes (optional)

Start with 63 sheets of card card stock (normal 8 1/2 by 11 pages) - each sheet of card stock is a numbered 'square'.

Make the goose pages:

Find a picture of a goose, enlarge and print the goose onto 13 sheets of the card stock. Also add the number for these 'pages'.

Squares five (5), nine (9), fourteen (14), eighteen (18), twenty-three (23), twenty-seven (27), thirty-two (32), thirty-six (36), forty-one (41), forty-five (45), fifty (50), fifty-four (54) and fifty-nine (59) have a goose on them.

Make the 'hazard' pages:

Find pictures that would correspond to the 'hazards' (bridge, maze, tavern, well, prison, death) enlarge and print them on the corresponding page, along with their number.

Square six (6) is The Bridge and the player immediately advances to square twelve (12). Square fortytwo (42) is The Maze and the player is sent back to square thirty (30). Square

nineteen (19) is the The Tavern and the player loses two turns.

thirty-one (31) is The Well. A player landing there must remain until another player lands on that square. The second player then remains there while the first player returns to the square the second player started that turn from.

Square fifty-two (52) is The Prison which is played exactly the same as The Well.

Square fifty-eight (58) is Death and the player starts over.

The rest of the squares:

On the rest of the pages, just print an enlarged number.

I added a few more 'learning' squares along the way.. example, we were teaching the colors of heraldry, so every so often I would have one of the colors as one of the numbered pages, and the child would say (in heraldic terms) what that color was if they landed on it. For the younger kids, the name of the color was also printed on those pages. (My pages were 'laminated' with plastic to make them last longer, but that is not mandatory.)

Tape the squares to the floor in numeric order, use a tape that is easy to get off (recommend masking tape - don't use duct tape on a hardwood floor, your site owners will be very unhappy with you). Put enough space between the squares so that the kids can maneuver without running into each other. (recommend a few inches to a foot between them). We used a 'snaking' layout versus a circle as it was easier to manage in the amount of space we had. At the end of the game, I had a basket full of 'bagged' prizes, each child that made it through to the end of the game got to pick a bag. With the kids as the 'playing pieces', play the game following standard instructions for goose. http://www.recoveredscience.com/gooserules.htm

This game is a blast for young and old alike.
