

BARONIAL ARTS & SCIENCES COMPETITION REQUIREMENTS

Individuals entering to compete for the Loch Salann Baronial Championship, must follow these guidelines and submit your entries by 11:00 a.m., 3/14/09. Those not entering to compete for Champion may enter up to 3 individual items. These may be judged by fewer judges.

- 1. The entrant must have entries in a minimum of 3 Grand Categories, with a maximum of 8 entries.
- 2. The entrant be aware that documentation counts in the scoring. Written documentation is required. The minimum documentation is "Kitten's Documentation Form" as found in the March 2009 issue of The Sage Advice. The article is by Baroness Casamira, Kingdom MOAS.
- 3. The entrant must be a member in good standing of the Barony of Loch Salann and present a current membership card.

The form in the Sage Advice is from *Kitten Reames, mka:Duchess Caterina de Forza d'Agro, OL, OP, Atlantia:* <u>Kitten's EASY A.B.C.</u> Documentation Form.






Loch Salann Defender Tourney Barony of Loch Salann March 14, 2009

Jan 27, 09 cook's guild

Scottish Cooking is a challenge! The first records of Scottish recipes is an unpublished manuscript dated 1710. Catherine Brown is one of the well known writers on Scottish cooking. By taking "records of trade, agriculture and fishing . . . descriptions from traveler . . . (and) household accounts", Ms. Brown put together several pamphlets and cookbooks. Trade with Europe, particularly France occurred during the middle ages and affected food customs, especially introducing spices, such as ginger.

The Scots are very frugal and use everything available.

Tongue from beef, sheep and other animals were
mentioned. So, I decided the cook's guild needed to eat
tongue - and I had a beef tongue.

Instructions were very basic. Boil the tongue for a long time in spices. Peel and slice the lean meat, and serve it in a sauce.

For the cook's guild dish, I simmered the tongue for over 4 hours in a handful of pickling spices and 2 sliced onion. I refrigerated the tongue for use the next day. I saved some of the liquid for use in the brown sauce.

The basic brown sauce starts with a roux diluted with beef broth. I used some beef broth concentrate and some of the juice with pickling spices. To enhance the flavor, I added sautéed onions and mushrooms.

I made the sauce and added the cold, slices of tongue. I added enough water to cover the tongue so it would heat, and the sauce became more of a soup than a sauce.

The flavor was excellent and I was disappointed that there weren't more leftovers!

Chicken barley soup - recipe

Chicken Barley Soup Use leftover chicken or turkey to make this light broth-based soup.

3 tablespoons butter or margarine

Fresh parsley sprigs, optional

2 large onions, thinly sliced

2 clove garlic, pressed or minced

2 quarts regular-strength chicken broth

1 cup barley

1/4 teaspoon anise seed

3 small carrots, peeled

2 medium-size oranges

2+ cups shredded cooked chicken or turkey

In a 4-quart pan, melt the butter over medium heat. Add onion and garlic; stir until onion is limp. Add broth (Chicken bullion + water), barley, and anise seed. Cover and simmer until barley is tender to bite, about 30 minutes. Cut carrots into 1/4-inch slices and add to broth; continue simmering, covered, until carrots are tender to bite, about 10 minutes longer. Grate enough peel from oranges to make 1/4 teaspoon. Cut peel and white membrane from oranges and cut segments free. When carrots are done, add orange peel, orange segments, and chicken. Simmer, covered, until chicken is hot, about 5 minutes longer. Garnish with parsley.

Probability of period use of oranges is minimal!

Carrot custard:

4 eggs, buttermilk, honey, carrots, cinnamon, cloves, nutmeg, salt.

Cook carrots. (Microwave sliced carrots?)

Mash

Add eggs, buttermilk, honey and spices.

Mix.

Pour into a pan (mould) and boil (steam) for about 60 minutes???

Cool and unmold.

Almoner's Pouch, by THL Bethoc du Crawford

In the middle ages poor and disabled people would sit outside the gates of the castle and beg for money, this was usually called 'alms'. This is how they made their living.

To make an Almoner pouch.

Start with a rectangle of fabric. Felt squares at the craft store work really well for this.


Fold the top over about $\frac{1}{2}$ to 1 inch from the top and sew a 'hem.

Sew all the way across the line hemline



Fold the fabric over lengthwise so that the long edges are together.

Leaving the 'hem end open, sew a thin seam, all along the long edge, then all the way across the bottom edge. This makes kind of a long pocket.



Turn your pouch inside out so that all the sewn edges and seams are on the inside.

Thread a string or ribbon through the 'hemmed end of the pouch and tie the ends together. Make the string long enough so that you can use it to pull your pouch shut, tie it so it stays shut, and put your belt through the loop.

Now when you walk past the poor people, you can easily reach into your pouch and give them a coin.
