



HEARTHWARMING X : TO LIVE THE DREAM

August 18 - 20, 2000 Wendell, Idaho

Through the heart of Twae Linnes runs the River known simply as "The Snake". Slowly winding it's way deep in it's canyon towards the sea many miles away, it passes an isle of lush vegetation ,shady and cool with many trees and covered with a carpet of deep green grass. Falling from the side of the Canyon, waterfalls cause a soft mist to float serenely about, before settling into a gently flowing brook weaving it's way slowly among the rocks and boulders to join the Snake on it's journey. Upon these boulders, someone easily mistaken as wood nymphs can be seen sunning themselves after a cool refreshing swim, while Pelicans and cranes wheel lazily about in the air. Throughout our glorious history as Artemisian's, we have always held that there is a time to work hard and be serious and a time to let our hair down and have fun; to "Live the Dream". In this tradition, Hearthwarming was founded as an event to come and leave the cares and worries of responsibility behind and live our dreams, if only for a few days. This year we will thus celebrate the tenth year of the Hearthwarming, and we invite all our friends, both those that have come and shared the Dream with us for many a year, and those we have yet to meet to come and share their Dream with us. Come, share in our traditions and help us to create new ones. Among the traditional activities occurring will be the Hearthwarming tournament, the torchlight greatsword tournament, our freeform bardic prize tournament, and of course . . . eating. This years new activities will include a horse drawn hayride, highland games, equestrian activities, and many activities for the young lords and ladies to be looked after by our own Pied Piper, Lady Francesca. As always, food plays a major part in Hearthwarming. Some have even been known to say "If you go away hungry, it's your own fault." In times past, we have been challenged as to our ability to suitably fulfill this promise, and have proven our claim well enough that a certain young Lord begged that we cease. For those who arrive on Friday, there will be the customary pot of "rock stew" keeping warm on the hearth till the wee sma' hours of the night. Both Saturday and Sunday mornings will see allyou-can-eat breakfasts, while Saturday evening you will be stuffed with a pound of meat and all the trimmings. The site is the beautiful Emerson Pugmire Memorial Park (formerly known as Niagara Springs) down in the Snake River Canyon surrounded by the Snake River on two sides, and a clear, cool spring-fed stream on the third. Required miscellaneous information: The site is wet, so bring drinkables (no glass containers). Pet's are welcome, but leashes are REQUIRED. Fires are limited to the built in firepits or to above-ground fireproof portable pits, though tiki torches and such are allowed. There are dumpsters on site, and there will be garbage removal. SITE OPENS: Friday August 18th at 12 noon and CLOSES Sunday August 20th at 4 PM. SITE FEE: \$7 FEAST FEE: \$11 Children 6 yrs to 12 yrs are 1/2 price; Children 5 and younger are free. Advance reservations are appreciated, but not required: "If you come, we will feed you" Make check's payable to: "Shire of Twae Linnes, SCA, Inc." PO Box 347, Filer ID 83328 DIRECTIONS: From I-84 east or west take Wendell exit #157. Turn South toward the canyon. Continue 9 miles the road will turn and head down into the canyon. Follow to the site. The road will be marked with signs from the exits on.

After a while, we all meandered over to one of the pavillions, and there were joined by more musicians: Lady Cecily de Percy (guitar), Lord Albion (guitar and guittarone), and Lady Bengte (percussion). Since nothing was happening, and the musicians were handy, Baron Niccolo Gianfigliazzi Genovese used the open space between the pavillions to dance Amaroso with Lady Aeschine Larke.

About one o'clock, Lady Muirenn blew her trumpet and the last court of King Connor and Queen Faun began. During this final court, there were several arts presentations. Lord Albion sang Under a Violet Moon, accompanying himself on guitar. This song is said to be a favorite of Faun's. Lord Wilhelm von Adlersheim sang a song in German, bidding farewell to his king and queen. After the Queen's Guard stepped down, this same lord commemorated the event with some quite good poetry "For Those Who Guard the Queen." Lady Cecily de Farington sang Gryphon of Artemisia, a song she had originally written in honor of Sir Sean Kirkpatrick. The king presented a signet ring portraying a gryphon to Sir Sean Kirkpatrick, mentioned here because it was a fine example of silversmithing. Lord Albion played his guitar as background while Connor and Faun divested themselves of the trappings of power (also artworks), the mantles (Mistress Yelisveta Katlin Savrasova), the sword of state (I wish I knew), and the crowns themselves (Mistress Carol of Stargate). They processed out to the Non Nobis Domine from Henry V, a chorus led by Wilhelm von Adlersheim and joined in by many others.

A variety of fine scrolls were presented during this and the following courts. These were by a variety of people, including (at least) the following: Joanna de Paladin (2), Mistress Casamira Jawjalny, Tangwistle (2), Mistress Margaret Mendeith, and--doubtless--several others. (I did not start taking notes until this court was half over.) Also noteworthy in this first court of the day (and last court of Connor and Faun) was the sense of theater shown by their herald, Dame Varia Goffe. She was everything a herald should be. Not only was she loud enough to hear, but she announced all that was happening.

We broke for lunch. Lady Isabeau Somme de Ville and her kitchen staff have certainly mastered the Art of Cooking. The food available for both and lunch and dinner was of a very good quality.

Sometime after 3:00, the Coronation itself began to happen. Lady Muirenn's trumpet sounded the start, and the populous participated in a bit of theater as they tossed rose petals over HRH Basil and Renee. When they came up to the front of the court, Basil and Renee were seen to be wearing new clothing, very much in the German mode. Their costumes were made for them by Lady Heloise de Bec, with the assistance of Sir Gregory de Bec, Baroness Cortelyn, Mistress Elisabeth, her Ladyship Morwenna Oriana, and a friend named Robyn. Lady Velma of the Purple Dragon supplied music for this court from time to time, playing her harp. Lord Braden sang as Basil brought his lady forward to be crowned. While the crowns were passed around, Basil and Renee assumed the mantles and chains of state (the former by Mistress Katlin, the latter by Mistress Carol of Stargate), and The Burden of the Crown was sung by Lord Conchochbar (pronounced "Connor"). During the swearing of fealties, Albion played the Artemisian Anthem on his guitar, joined by other musicians on a variety of instruments. I played solo during the populous swearing, feeling rather lonely. Connor and Faun received coronets in honor of their change in status to Count and Countess. These were designed by Master William. Lord Sqytaan (pronounced "Sheetan") supplied the chainmail favors for the King's Guard, while the Queen's Courtiers and Ladies-in-Waiting were presented with drawstring bags of deep blue velvet with the outline of a gryphon's feather embroidered on them. A Charter for the Needleworkers' Guild of Artemisia was submitted to her majesty. While we waited for the recipient of a presentation to be found, Alan Youngforest told us all a delightful tale about a princess of Artemisia who had been abducted, leaving a trail of chocolate behind her all the way to An Tir.

Before this court closed, it was announced that all those wishing to compete to be the new Bard of Artemisia should report to the current holder of the title, Lord Albion. This competition was to take place after the Rapier Competition, and after the feast. Alas, I cannot report on it, for, along with most of the other instrumental musicians, I had only come for the day, and had to leave after the feast. (CONGRATULATIONS LORD BRADEN!!!!) It was exquisitely delicious, and well worth waiting for.

Also worth mentioning, in connection with the fabric arts, is the costume Mistress Courtney (from Dael Beort) made for Mistress Casamira Jawjalny. It is a complete set of motley, or and gules, complete with cap and bells. Both Casamira and her bauble ("Shirley U Geste") think they may have found the look for this Polish Punster.

My apologies for the haphazard use of titles. If you are a "Master" and I listed you as a "Lord" or "m'lady" and I listed you as "Lady," please forgive me. I am but a humble musician, and I did at least manage to get the musicians and instruments listed together fairly accurately. Yours in Service... (Mistress Anne de Junius)

Directions:

Coming from the South, West, East or Northwest -- take your best route to Vernal. Turn off of Main Street (US Route 40/191) onto Vernal Avenue which is in the center of town. Going North on Vernal Avenue (US Route 191), you go up into the mountains through several switchbacks. Continue until you come to the Red Cloud Loop turnoff on the left. You travel on Forest Road 18 to the Iron Springs Campground. Approximate mileage from Vernal to Iron Springs Campground is 27 miles. **Coming from the North**, take best route to US Route 191 South. Continue south until you reach the Red Cloud Loop turnoff. Turn right onto Forest Road 18 then on to Iron Springs Campground. Approximate mileage from Manilla, Utah to Iron Springs Campground is 51 miles.

There will be SCA signs posted at Main/Vernal Avenue intersection, along US Route 191 going North, at Red Cloud Loop turnoff and at turnoff to Iron Springs Campground on Forest Road 18.

Pets are allowed but must be on leash at all times (Forest Service rules)

Fire regulations (6/21/00 per BLM website):

"The fire restriction order prohibits open fires of any kind except campfires in developed campgrounds and facilities; smoking, except in vehicles, boats, developed recreation sites, residences or in an area at least three feet in diameter that is cleared of all flammable materials; and fireworks, tracer ammunition or other pyrotechnic devices."

So, at ths point, open flame will be allowed only in existing firepits. Tiki torches not allowed. Advise candle lanterns. You MUST have with you a general fire extinguisher and/or shovel, sand, water accessible in your camp.

Keep in mind that this might change before the event due to weather and fire conditions in area. "Let the games begin!" The Barony of Loch Salann and the Incipient Shire of Dragon's Rest Once again invite you to enjoy gentle dalliance, tournaments of skill, and displays of bardic prowess at Artemisian Games. In addition to the many activities described below, we will also be hosting several merchants to provide wares to lighten your wallet and weigh down your carriage. There will also be a professional restauranteur providing midday and evening meals on site Friday and Saturday.

The following activities have been scheduled:

St. George and the Dragon tournament will be held. This tournament is unique to Artemisian Games, involving two fighters bound to one another back to back (the dragon) fighting a single fighter (St. George).

A challenge for all heavy fighters of skill, cunning, prowess and fleet of foot to compete in the Arrow Melee. If you haven't fought in this melee in the past, it must be seen or experienced to be believed!

Baron Ulrich will once again sponsor a five-weapon tournament similar to last year. The prize for this tournament will be a 1300's period longsword.

Dragons Rest will sponsor two rapier tournaments. A torchlight tourney on Friday night and a double elimination tourney on Saturday.

Dragons Rest will sponsor a Target Archery Competition. The styles of shoots will be posted on Artemisian Games website and/or the Aerie prior to the event.

For the children we will once again hold the Capture the Banner tournament. The victor from last year, Chrystall MacKellar, challenges all comers to defeat him in this game of cunning skill Other children's activities may be scheduled as well.

Baron Ulrich will also be sponsoring a Bardic Circle on Saturday evening in his encampment. Performance artists are encouraged to bring music, tales of adventure, feats of skill or stories of wit and humor to entertain the populace. A Champion will be chosen by the attending populace.

Site will open at 4:00 pm on Thursday, August 24th and will close at 3:00 pm on Sunday, August 27th.

> Guissell (Herb Stuffing) 1/2 cup beef or poultry stock 1 teaspoon minced sage 1 Tablespoon parsley flakes or 1 sprig fresh parsley, minced A pinch powdered saffron 3 eggs, beaten 1 cup bread crumbs


Place broth and spices in a pot and bring to a boil. Meanwhile combine eggs and bread crumbs in a bowl. Add the bread crumb mixture all at once to the broth. Reduce heat and stir until it all comes together more or less in a ball and all the liquid is absorbed. Serve hot. Makes about 2 cups.
