



Once again, our great Sword of State will be discussed at the Populace Meeting this month. Please feel free to introduce your ideas and comments concerning this icon to our strength.

As of the Coronation of Konrad and Kortland on July 14th, the fee for **Heraldic submissions in the Kingdom of Artemisia will be increasing to \$12 per item (names, devices, badges, etc.). This increase is due to the U.S. Postal Service postage rate increases that have occurred already and are to be occurring later this year.

Pets are allowed but must be on leash at all times. Quiet time from 10 pm to 6 am (Forest Service site rental stipulations) Fires in existing firepits and above ground firepits are permitted. Water is available on site by means of one hand pump well. Last year there was extreme fire danger in Ashley National Forest. So far this year there are no severe warnings or restrictions. The Shire of Dragonmarch invites you to enjoy 4 days in the cool of the Uintah mountains at Artemisian Games traditional site – Iron Springs Campground. Tournaments of skill, displays of bardic prowess, children's activities and – who knows what else we'll come up with before site opens.

In addition to the many activities described below, we will also be hosting several merchants to provide wares to lighten your wallet and weigh down your carriage. There will also be a professional restauranteur providing midday and evening meals on site Friday and Saturday. Coming from the South, West, East or Northwest – take your best route to Vernal. Turn off of Main Street (US Route 40/191) onto Vernal Avenue which is in the center of town. Going North on Vernal Avenue (US Route 191), you go up into the mountains through several switchbacks. Continue until you come to the Red Cloud Loop turnoff on the left. You travel on Forest Road 18 to the Iron Springs Campground. Approximate mileage from Vernal to Iron Springs Campground is 27 miles.

Coming from the North, take best route to US Route 191 South. Continue south until you reach the Red Cloud Loop turnoff. Turn right onto Forest Road 18 then on to Iron Springs Campground. Approximate mileage from Manilla, Utah to Iron Springs Campground is 51 miles.

Richard I, the Lion-Hearted

(part three in a continuing genealogy of the Plantagenets)

Richard followed his father on the throne on 3 September 1189, having out-survived his two older brothers. He wasted no time grieving his father. The two had been openly in arms at Henry's death. Despite his contentions with his father, Richard's favor fell on those who had loyally supported Henry, even against him. Among these was William the Marshal, who had held the rearguard against Richard when Henry had fled Le Mans. William had had Richard at his mercy at the time but had killed only his horse. "I will not slay you," the Marshal had said "The Devil may slay you!" Richard rose above the grave insult; he confirmed The Marshal in his offices and lands and saw him married to Isabel de Clare, heiress of Pembroke, making The Marshal one of his most powerful barons.

Richard was tall and strong; he rejoiced in personal combat. He was no politician. Churchill says his alliances were formed upon his likes and dislikes. He was much more interested in going on Crusade then he was in ruling either his Kingdom in England or duchies in France that came to him via his mother, Eleanor of Aquitaine. Soon after he came to the throne, he set about raising funds for what would be the Third Crusade. This Crusade was marred by the quarrels of the allies involved in it. Philip Augustus of France, one of them, left the Holy Land and returned home to his own intrigues, including conspiring with Prince John against absent Richard. Richard personally insulted Duke Leopold of Austria, who headed for home. Richard's army, despite his able leadership, was unable to take Jerusalem, though it was within their sight.

By 1192, the news from England was so bad that Richard knew he had to return home. A treaty was reached with Salladin that opened the Holy Sepulcher to pilgrimage. Richard had to be content with that. Richard left for home sought to make his way through Germany in disguise but was taken prisoner by Duke Leopold, then imprisoned by the Holy Roman Emperor, Henry VI. A ransom of 150,000 marks was demanded, an amount the represented twice the annual revenue of the English crown. Behind Richard's back, his brother John and Philip Augustus of France offered the Emperor 80,000 marks to keep Richard under lock and key

July 10, 2001 was the evening of the Baronial Cook's Guild Meeting. We met at Lordship Vogg's abode to prepare and partake of a sumptuous Polish feast, under the direction of Mistress Casamira. These tow good gentiles were aided in their efforts by Mistress Margaret and Master Edward Mendeith.

The recipes were all quite simple and easy to prepare. We had Lemon Soup, Brigands' Pot Roast, Lazy Dumplings, Plum Dumplings, and Pierogi with Cherries. After much good humor and companionship we sat down to eat and chose the following recipe to share.

Lemon Soup

2 egg yolks

1 Tablespoon flour

2/3 cup sour cream

6 cups chicken stock

Grated rind from 1 small to medium lemon

Juice of same lemon

Beat raw egg yolks and flour into sour cream until thoroughly smooth. Slowly add hot, strained stock. being careful not to let liquid curdle. Add lemon rind. Since tastes differ, add lemon juice a little at a time, or soup may turn out to be too tart. Heat thoroughly on very low heat. Serve with croutons or hot boiled rice. Makes 6 to 7 servings.

until Michaelmas 1194 or 150,000 marks to deliver him into their hands. The Emperor held to his bargain with Richard, however. The staggering ransom had to be raised; both church and lay lands bore the burden equally. Prince John set an example in collecting these taxes—but kept the proceeds for himself. Three attempts were made to raise the ransom; the entire amount could not be found, though England and Normandy were taxed to their limits. The Emperor realized he could not get more. On payment of the first installment, he freed Richard in February 1194.

Richard returned to England, where, of course, John had already declared him dead and had himself crowned king. He was in open rebellion when Richard returned. John fled to France. Richard was recrowned in London. Now at war with Philip Augustus of France, Richard stayed in England only long enough to raise money and gather knights. After he managed this, he left England to defend his French possessions and never returned.

John asked for and received Richard's pardon, despite the knowledge John would have left him in the hands of Henry VI. Richard restored estates to John, though not those fortresses that John could man against him. The rest of Richard's reign was spent defending his French possession, raising the money to do so in England. He died 6 April 1199 of gangrene from an arrow wound received during siege of a small castle, leaving his crown to John.

Most sources indicate that Richard and Berengaria had no children—indeed, they barely had time to have any, as they married on 12 May 1191, at Limassol, Cyprus, while Richard was on crusade and may not have consummated the marriage until 1195. One source (Tompsett, Brian, University of Hull, UK, website: www.dcs.hull.ac.uk/public/genealogy) shows a son, Philip, from the marriage; Family Search shows Philip as the son of a mistress. Tompsett also shows Fulk as the speculative offspring of Richard and Joan de St. Pol. It is certain, however, that Richard left no legitimate heir and few illegitimate possibilities.
