

Hear Ye! Hear Ye! Good gentles of the fair lands of Artemisia. 'Tis the time of year to remember all that has been graciously given unto us and to give thanks. We now present a wonderful opportunity to do so. Come join us in our quest to gather Christmas toys for the wee ones and food for those that hunger. 'Tis also a great time to come fight (heavy & rapier), eat (exquisite feast), make merry and more.

In the tradition of period ransom tourneys, all Combatants wishing to enter into the list will receive 5 tokens for a donation of 1 unwrapped new toy. The field will be open for challenges in all authorized weapon forms. Should a combatant run out of tokens during the course of battles, 5 additional tokens may be claimed at the list table by paying your ransom of another new, unwrapped toy. (Wal-Mart & K-Mart are close by) Non-combatants are encouraged to participate and may sponsor fighters onto the field by paying their ransom of 1 new, unwrapped toy for 5 tokens. Non- combatants may also donate toys in exchange for tokens which they may award to fighters as they feel fit for great deeds on and off the field. The combatant that has gained the most ransoms for the day shall be deemed the winner of the Ransom Tourney. All toys shall be donated to the USMC's Toys for Tots program to be distributed to those less fortunate than ourselves.

DIRECTIONS TO SITE: Make your way, by best route to I 84. Take the Twin Falls Exit. This will place you on highway 93. Turn south and take it into town. Bear right at the first stop light (right lane yields into cross street). You are now on pole line road. Travel west on pole line road for approximately 12 miles. Turn left on 2200 E. (there will be a sign indicating Twin Falls County Fair grounds, white with a red arrow, in addition to the SCA sign). Now traveling south on 2200 E. (Fair Ave. in Filer City), drive approximately 5 miles till you come to the city limits of Filer. (you will have crossed rail road tracks, and should have the Fairgrounds on your left. Turn right onto Main Street. Travel west on Main Street Travel approximately 1/2 to 1 mile. The American Legion Hall will be on your left @ 203 Main Street (next to the Library). Watch for SCA signs along the way to help guide you. Come and enjoy fine company, fine food, good fighting and the hospitality of the shire of Twae Linnes.

From the Cook's Corner

On the evening of October 3, 2000, The members of the Loch Salann Cook's Guild met at the home of Lady Constance de La Rose. Joining us were the Manager and the Chef of the airport Holiday Inn who had come to learn how to cook medievally, as they are preparing the feast for Arts and Sciences.

The dishes that we prepared were: Leek and Onion Soup, Roo Broth (Venison Stew), Barley Pilaff, Brussels Sprouts, and Apple Fritters with Vanilla Ice Cream and Boozenberries. All of the dishes that were prepared, with the exception of the Roo Broth, will be served at the event .

Our visitors seemed to enjoy themselves and even joined in the puns. After much revelry, we chose the following recipe to share.

Roo Broth (Venison Stew)

2 1/2 pounds venison stew meat, cut into chunks (stew meat may be used)
2 cups red wine
1/2 cup red wine vinegar
1/2 cup olive oil
2-3 onions, coarsely chopped
1/2 teaspoon dried thyme or more if fresh
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
2 teaspoons salt
1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
1/4 teaspoon ground mace or 4 blades mace tied in cheesecloth
2-3 slices whole wheat bread
1 1/2 cup water
3/4 cup currants
1/4 cup chopped parsley

If venison (or beef) has been frozen, thaw, save the meat juices that accumulate. To Marinate meat, mix wine, vinegar, olive oil, onions, and seasonings (except parsley) and pour this mixture over meat in pan. Cover and leave in the refrigerator for a day or two, then remove meat from marinade with a slotted spoon and dry on towels. Strain some marinade over the bread in a blender or food processor jar and leave to soak while you brown the meat in fat or oil. As the brown, remove the pieces to a stew pot. When all are browned, blend the soaked bread and add it to the pot along with the water (with which you have rinsed the browning pan), the marinade, and any blood or meat juices left after thawing; bring to a boil, then lower heat and simmer 1 hour. Then--or when reheating--add the currants and parsley, and cook for 30 minutes more. Taste for seasoning. You may wish to add salt, pepper, cinnamon, and/or vinegar. Serve.
