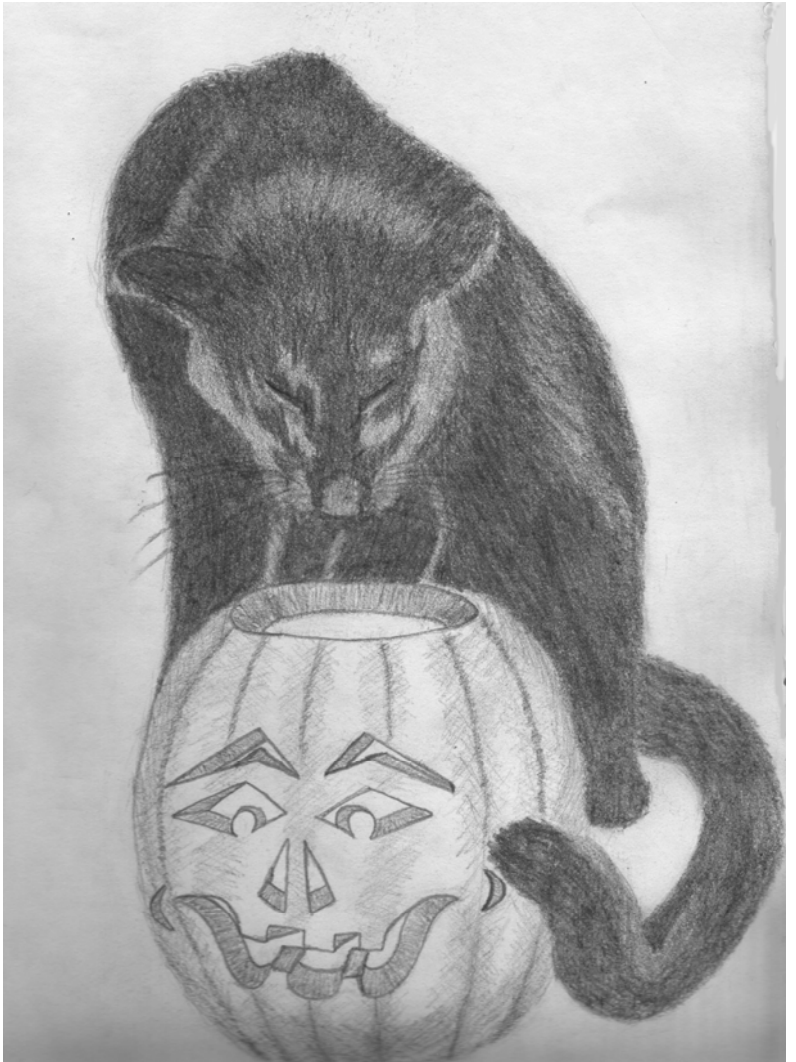


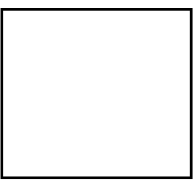
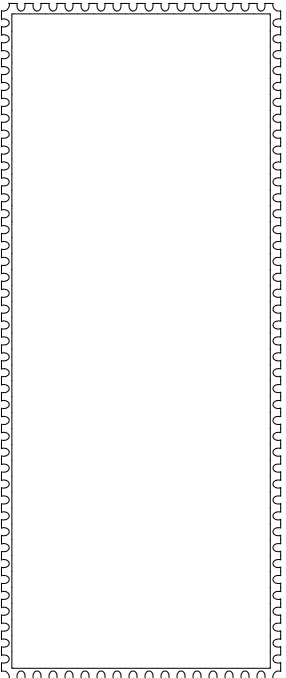

Henry III

(part five in a continuing genealogy of the Plantagenets)
By Fiona the Norseman's Daughter

Henry came to the throne at age nine, when his father John, in the middle of a conflict with his Barons, died of dysentery. Crowned in his minority, William the Marshall, who had served the Plantagenet family through from Stephen on, became his first regent. William governed for the young king until William's death in 1219, and reissued the Magna Carta, The Great Charter. Hugh De Burgh governed until Henry was 25.

The charter was reissued several times in Henry's minority—the Barons wished to bind the King to the same feudal laws that bound them. A class of free men was emerging and demanding its rights; the concept of England as a communal entity was emerging. Henry was out of step, in more ways than one. He dismissed Hugh De Burgh in 1232; let himself be dominated by Peter de Roches, Bishop of Winchester, and Peter des Rivaux until the Barons brought their influence to an end.

The breach between Henry and his Barons began as early as 1237, when the Barons became displeased by the influence of his bride, Eleanor of Provence, and her relatives over Henry. The influence of foreigners in Henry's court was strong—Henry's sister Eleanor had married a young French favorite, Simon De Montfort, which increased the foreign contingent around him. He was drawn into a disastrous venture in France by his Lusignan half brothers in 1242; the barons demanded a say in choice of the King's counselors but were put off by Henry. In 1254 Henry agreed with Pope Innocent IV to finance papal wars in Sicily if the pope would grant his infant son, Edmund, the crown of Sicily. In 1258, he levied a tax to pay his debts for the war in Wales and the failed campaign in France, and church building. Pope Alexander threatened to excommunicate Henry for

From the Cook's Corner

The Cook's Guild was scheduled to meet on the evening of September 4, 2001. Due to the unexpected illness of our hostess, Lady Constance, we had to cancel the gathering. We wish Constance a speedy recovery. Rather than disappoint the Quill readers, we delved into the Cook's Guild recipe archives and came up with the following recipes to share.

Zucchini with Garlic

4 to 5 small zucchini
7 or 8 cloves garlic, peeled
Finely chopped parsley
1 cup olive oil
Salt and pepper, to taste.

Wash the zucchini and cut a slit in them with a knife. Put the garlic cloves in the slit and place them in a shallow baking pan. Pour the oil over them to coat them. Sprinkle with the parsley, salt and pepper. Bake in a moderate (350 degree) oven for 1 hour. Serve.

Apple-Almond Pudding

1/4 cup rice flour (or cornstarch)
1/4 cup ground almonds
2 cup water or milk (or a combination of the two)
1 pound cooking apples, pared, cored and diced fine
1/8 teaspoon each of ground clove, salt, ginger and nutmeg
1/2 cup sugar (less if apples are sweet)
1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
Pinch of saffron or yellow food coloring

Mix rice flour, ground almonds, and water and/or milk in a large saucepan. Stir in the apples and bring to a boil over medium heat. Stir and boil about 5 minutes, or until the pudding is quite thick. In a bowl mix all the spices, except the nutmeg, with a spoonful of the pudding. When mixed, stir back into the rest of the pudding. When thoroughly blended, pour into a serving dish. Sprinkle nutmeg over the top and cool and/or chill. This can be served as is, or if preferred, with sweetened cream.

failing to come up with the money; Henry appealed to the barons, who agreed to cooperate if Henry would agree to reforms. The reforms, the Provisions of Oxford, created a 15-member privy council. The King's proclamation accepting the Provisions was made in English as well as French, a first. It was about this time, also, that the word Parliament came into use.

Henry regained power when the Baron-members of the Privy Council quarreled among themselves. He renounced the Provisions in 1261, provoking a civil war in 1264. Though Henry's oldest son Edward led the king's forces against the Barons' leader, the same Simon de Montfort who had married Henry's sister Eleanor, De Montfort defeated Edward at the Battle of Lewes and captured both Henry and Edward. De Montfort was now in control of the government.

Simon de Montfort was a reformer who rebuked the nobility for their abuses as he had rebuked the King. Some saw De Montfort as as much of a threat to their interests as Henry had been; reaction set in against him. De Montfort summoned Parliament in 1265, counting on strong popular support. He got that. He also got trouble. Prince Edward escaped and made use of the discontent to split the Baronial opposition. He gathered his supporters against De Montfort; promised to uphold the Charter, remedy grievances, and expel the foreigners who had moved in with Eleanor of Provence and outraged the English nobility. The drove De Montfort back into South Wales and, when he tried to break out and join his son Simon at Kenilworth, he was caught by Edward's forces at Evesham. He died at the battle there, a hero on the field.

Henry, weak and senile, now turned actual government over to Edward and enjoyed peace in the last years of his life. He died 16 Nov 1272, in London. He is remembered as a great patron of ecclesiastical architecture, having rebuilt Westminster Abbey and constructed Salisbury Cathedral (1220-66).

Henry married Eleanor of Provence 14 Jan 1236, in Canterbury Cathedral, Kent. Four of their nine children survived childhood. Edward I followed his father on the throne.
