

Several changes are in the works for hardsuit standards. The least popular by far is the enforcement of the demi-gauntlet requirement that has been in the standards for at least two years. Word that I have from the Earl Marshal is that this standard will be enforced as of October 1. As of August 25, there is still no official publication of these standards, I will disseminate this information at fighter's practice as soon as I receive and understand them.

As most of the rapier fighters know, rapier standards are also changing. Again I have no official information, but will propagate it once I have it. This is the change that has been in the works for the last year.



Alchemy - Both cooked and non-cooked: soap, candles, pot-pourri, perfume, etc. Also includes inks, paints and pigments.

Armor - Parade, field, ring mail, chain mail, flexible armor, leather, gambesons, etc. or SCA-only.

Brewing, Vintning and Cordials - Beer, ale, lager, stout, liqueurs, mead, wine, sparkling wine, etc.

Ceramics - Coiled, flat construction, modeled, molded, wheel-thrown, etc. Commercial molds are considered kits.

Cooking - Bread, cheese, main dish, non-alcoholic drinks, side dish, sweet dish/ desserts, etc. Subtleties are specifically confined to

the cooking category.

Costuming, Court - Pre-1000 AD, 1000–1400 AD, 1400–1500 AD, 1500–1600 AD, and non-European.

Costuming, Tourney - Same categories as Court.

Costume Accessories - Hats, shoes, gloves, purses, pouches, pomanders, masks, fans, etc. and detachable items for use on more

than one garment such as hoods, collars, cuffs, stomachers, beaded ornamentation, etc. but not sleeves.

Demonstration Projects - This category is limited to 10 minutes.

Enameling - Basse-taille, champlevé, cloisonné, grisaille, Limoges, plique à jour, en resille.

Equestrian, Tack and Trappings - Tack, saddles, bits, bridles, barding, special riding garb, etc.

Equestrian, Performance - Demonstration of technique: period dressage and warhorse movements.

Falconry - Demonstration of technique; also accoutrements such as hoods, jesses, gloves, lures, etc.

Fief Holding - Animal husbandry, hunting/fishing equipment, gardening, horticulture, SCA cover-ups, shelters, etc.

Fine Arts - Drawing, painting, portraiture, sculpture, etc. Subtleties are specifically excluded from Fine Arts.

Glass - Lampwork, beads, blown vessels, stained glass, etc.

Heraldic Display - Heraldic displays in any media. This includes parades — which are limited to 10 minutes.

Horn, Bone, Ivory & Amber, Non-Jewelry - Carved, fabricated, inlaid, etc. Hounds - Demonstration of technique: coursing, hunting, etc; also accoutrements such as barding, lures, etc.

Jewelry - Soldered, non-soldered, strung jewelry, lapidary, etc. Knitting

Lace - Bobbin, needle, etc.

Leatherwork, Non-Armor - Shaped, tooled, etc.

Manuscript Arts - Calligraphy, illumination, cartography, etc.

Metalwork, Decorative Non-Jewelry - Casting, fabrication, etching, forging, raised work, chasing, repoussé, etc.

Metalwork, Functional Non-Jewelry - Same categories as Decorative. Knives and swords are entered under Functional Metalwork.

Musical Instruments - Brass, keyboard, percussion, string, woodwind, etc.

Needlework - Appliqué, beading, couching, counted work, cutwork, goldwork. needlepoint, needleweaving, pulled thread,

stumpwork, surface embroidery, etc.

Performing Arts: Solo - This category is limited to 10 minutes. Country dance, court dance, ethnic dance, instrumental music,

monologues, plays, reading, vocal music, etc.

Performing Arts: Group - Same categories as Solo, also limited to 10 minutes. Printing Sciences - Bookmaking, papermaking, printing, etc.

Textile Arts: Construction - Braiding, carding, dveing, resist dveing, fabric painting, felting, spinning, sprang, etc.

Textile Arts: Application - Basketry, brocade, card weaving, damask, inkle, plain weave, satin, tapestry, twill, etc.

Tools - Hand tools, production tools, scientific instruments, pens and brushes, etc.

Toys & Games - In any media.

Weapons - Bowyery, fletching, mechanical war machines, SCA weapons, etc. Knives and swords (if metal) are entered under

Functional Metalwork.

Woodwork, Decorative - Carving, joinery, inlay, marquetry, turned, etc.

Woodwork, Functional - Same categories as Decorative. Includes furniture.

Working Models/Historical Technology - Windmills, sawmills, looms, architecture, furnaces, kilns, forges, etc.

Writing: Fiction - Plays, poetry, tales, etc. Persona stories are allowed, but strongly discouraged.

Writing: Non-Fiction - Documentation, historical research, instructional articles, music, research projects, song (lyrics), etc.



From the Cook's Corner

On the evening of August 1, 2000, a few members of the Cook's Guild met at the home of His Lordship Vogg, to prepare and partake of the wondrous meal he had planned for us. This meal consisted of a variety of foods from the Middle East (Cyprus, Iran and Lebanon). The dishes were :Fakes Xithati (Sour Lentil Soup), Sheikh Al Mihshi (Stuffed Eggplant), Khoreshe Holu (Peach Sauce With Chicken), Chelou Ta Dig (Steamed Crusty Rice), Afelia II (Mushrooms With Coriander), and Dondurma Cileki (Strawberry Water Ice).

Unfortunately, due to some technical difficulties, namely a 4 1/2 hour power outage, some of the recipes were changed. They had to be adapted to cooking on a camp stove. The eggplant became a sort of stew, the crusty rice became "minute rice" and the strawberry ice became fresh strawberries. The food was still delicious. Imagine two camp stoves in a garage and eating in the driveway by candlelight, because the house was too warm.

After eating our fill, while enjoying a slight breeze. We decided to share the following recipe :

Fakes Xithati (Sour Lentil Soup)

2 cups brown lentils	1/3 cup olive oil		
8 cups water	1/4 cup cold water		
1 cup finely chopped green onions	1 Tablespoon flour		
1 clove garlic, crushed	1/4 cup vinegar (or to taste)		
1/4 cup finely chopped coriander	Salt		
leaves or parsley	Freshly ground black pepper		

Wash lentils in several changes of cold water, or place in sieve and run water through them. Drain. Put lentils in a large pot with 8 cups water, green onions, garlic, oil, and coriander or parsley (or a combination of the two if desired). Bring to a boil, cover pan and simmer on low heat for 1 hour or until lentils are soft. Make a smooth mixture of the flour and some water (roux). Pour this gradually into the boiling soup, stirring constantly until thickened slightly. Add vinegar, salt and pepper to taste. Return to a boil, boil gently for 5 minutes then serve hot. Tastes very good with a slight squeeze of lime juice. Serves 6.

The next scheduled meeting of the Cook's Guild is September 5, 2000, at Lordship Vogg's home. All are welcome and encouraged to come. The meal will be under the direction of Master and Mistress Mendeith, and will include homemade sausage.
