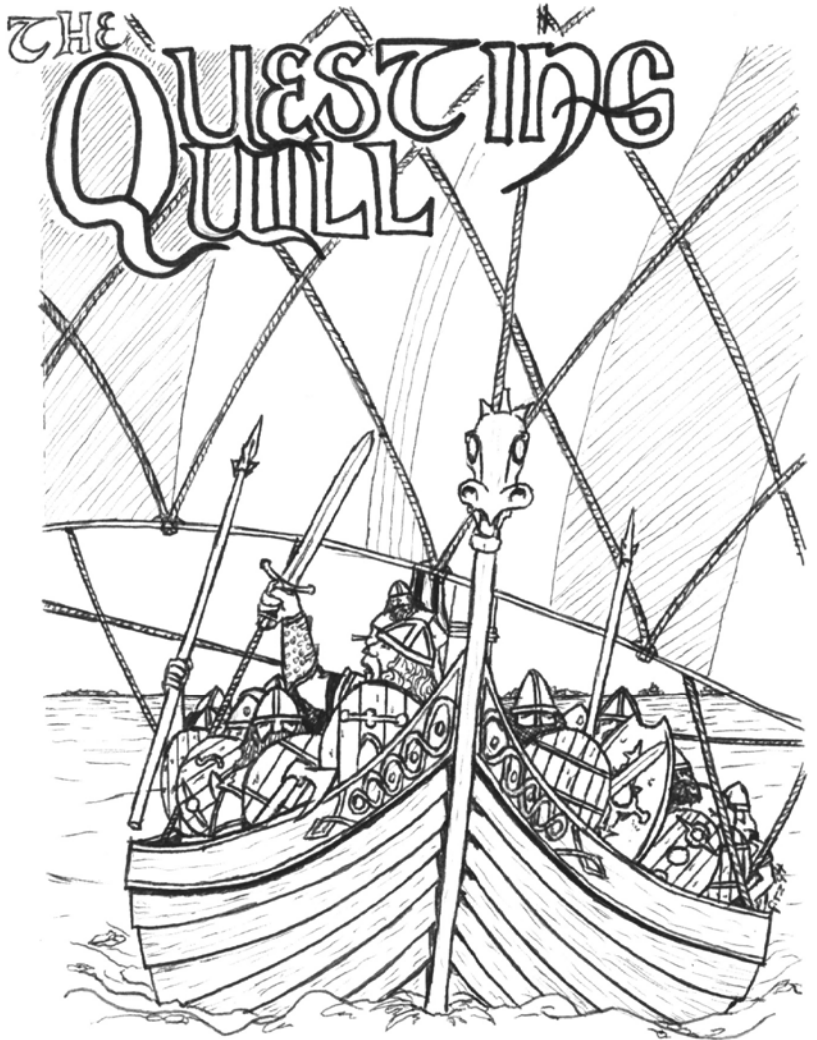


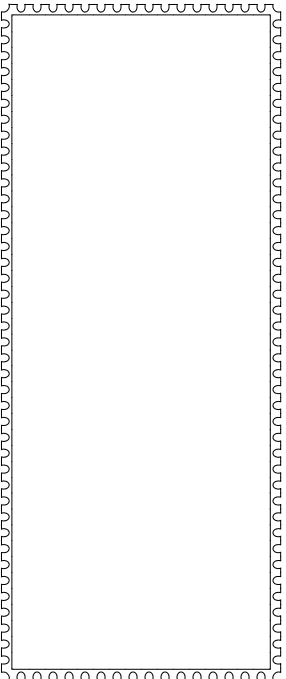

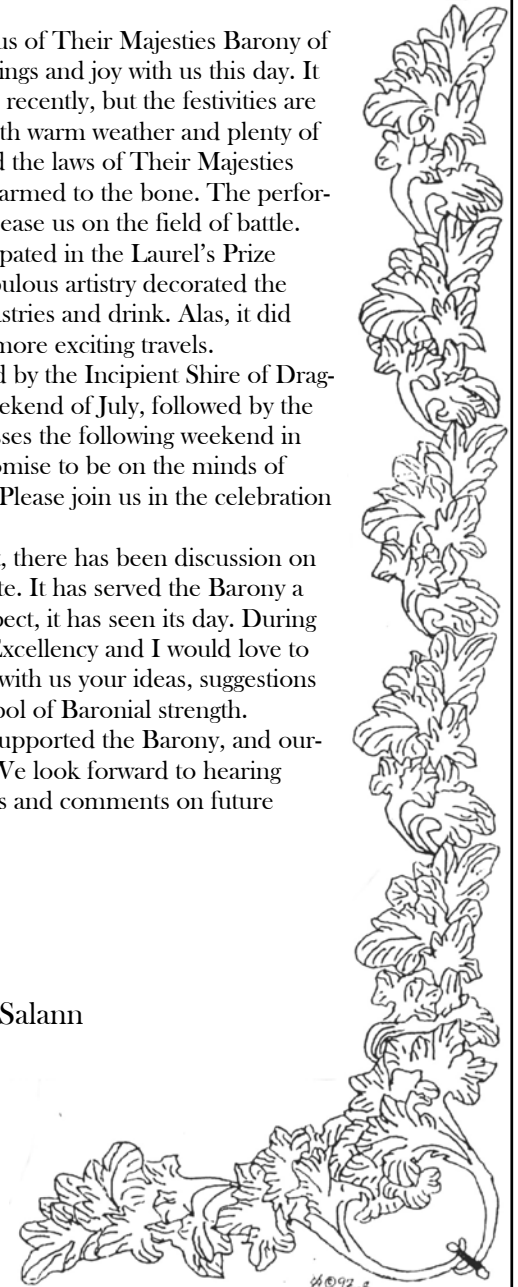

From the Knight Marshal:

Greetings members of our noble Barony

There will be NO FIGHTER PRACTICE on the 4th of July.

I will be stepping down as Knight Marshal on October 1, and am thus looking for some kind gentle who is willing to step forward and assume the responsibilities of the office of Knight Marshal. These responsibilities include:

- Ensuring the safety of ALL official fighting activities within the Barony
- Finding a winter site for, and running Baronial fighter practices
- Marshalling fighting at ALL local (and some foreign) events
- Reporting to the Earl Marshal monthly, and compiling a doomsday report yearly
- Attending Forum monthly to report and add your input into Baronial affairs
- Authorizing fighters to fight, and to expand their weapon form choices
- Training individuals interested in becoming Authorized Marshals

To help in these responsibilities, you will have a Rapier Deputy, an Archery Captain, and can recruit other deputies (one of which may be warranted if acceptable by the Earl Marshal). There will also be multiple warranted Marshals at Large who are willing to assist when needed.

As with all offices, the Knight Marshal must maintain membership in the SCA.

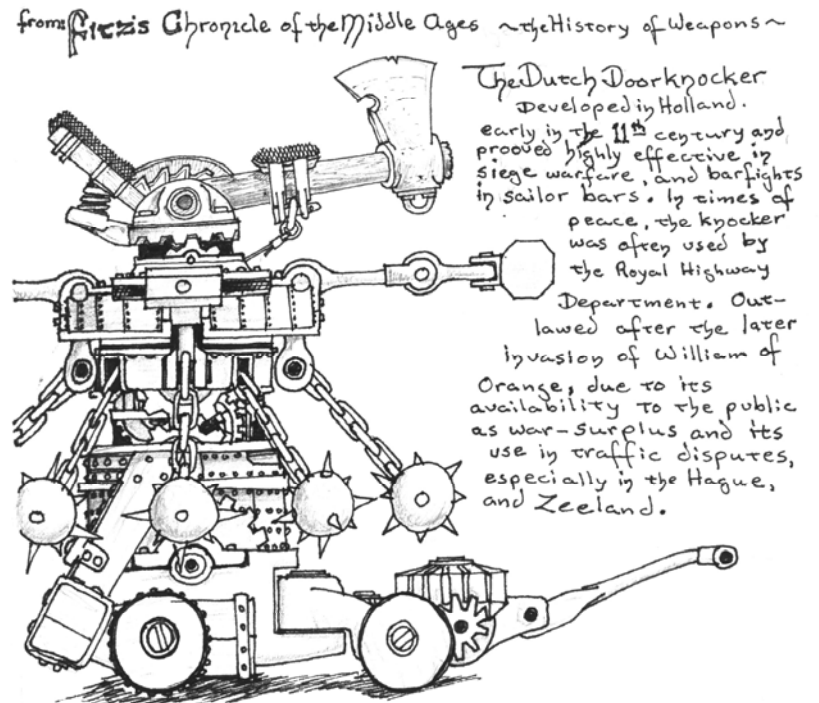

Fourth Annual Cutpurse Journey
July 6-8, 2001 Dragon March Vernal, UT

Merchants are welcomed with open arms and are asked to bring your wares. Please contact Merchant Steward if you plan on attending.

On Sunday the 8th, the noble fighters of Dragonmarch shall set aside their implements of battle and shall wield feast-cooking gear for your consumption and pleasure. Sign up for the Breaking of the Fast shall be available at the Registration point. The morning feast shall be eggs, sausage, bacon, hash browns, O.J., milk and bagels and/or English muffins.

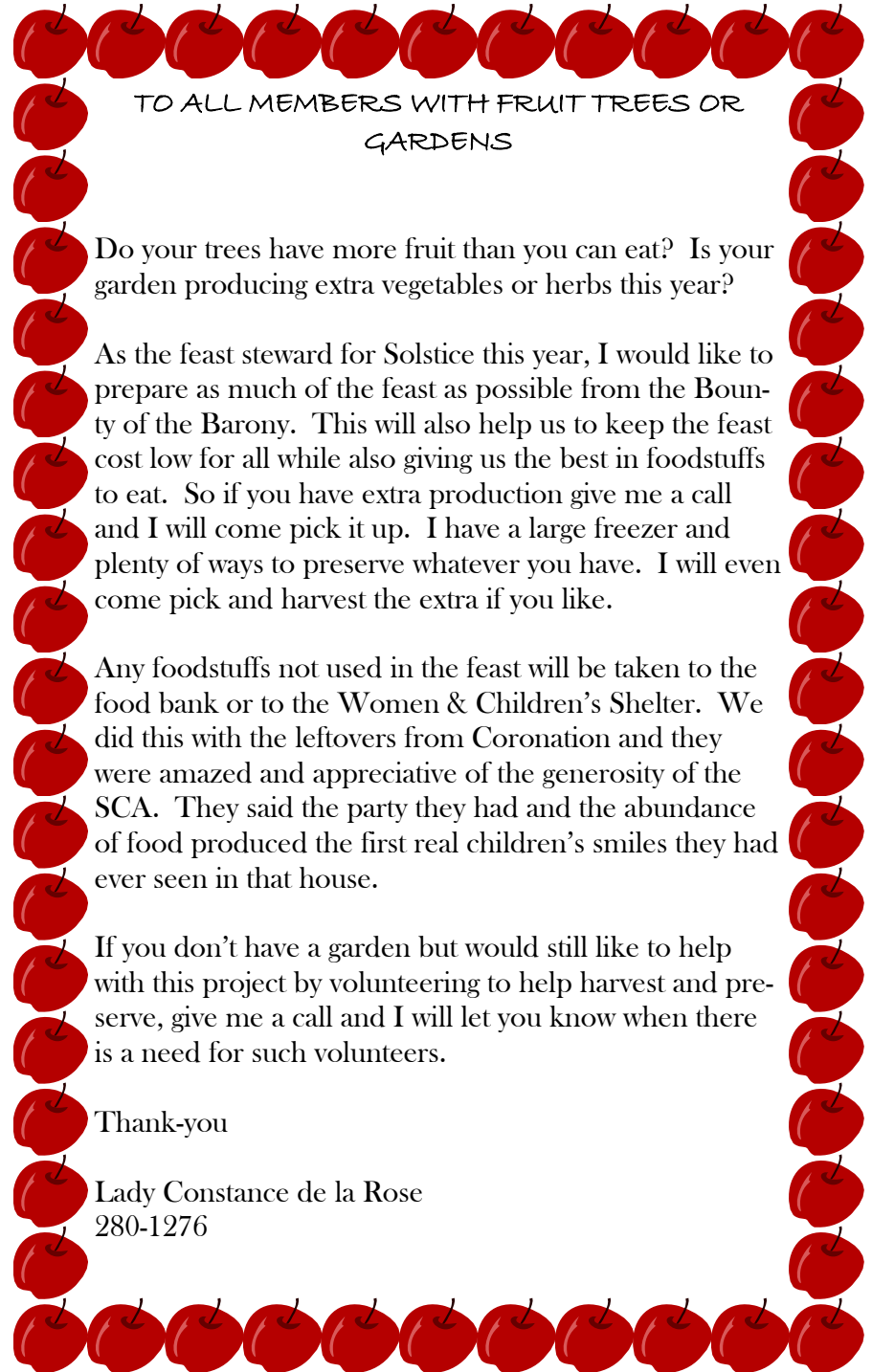
Site is at Iron Springs Campground, in the Ashley Valley National Forest.

Site opens Friday the 6th at 4:00 p.m. and closes Sunday at 12:00 p.m. This beautiful area is a wet site. Water is available on site. Fires shall be available in designated pits. Pets are allowed under leash. There is a quiet time in effect from 10:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m. as per park rules.

Directions to site:

Coming from the South, West, East or Northwest – take your best route to Vernal. Turn off of Main Street (US Route 40/191) onto Vernal Avenue which is in the center of town. Going North on Vernal Avenue (US Route 191), you go up into the mountains through several switchbacks. Continue until you come to the Red Cloud Loop turnoff on the left. You travel on Forest Road 18 to the Iron Springs Campground. Approximate mileage from Vernal to Iron Springs Campground is 27 miles.

Coming from the North, take best route to US Route 191 South. Continue south until you reach the Red Cloud Loop turnoff. Turn right onto Forest Road 18 then on to Iron Springs Campground. Approximate mileage from Manilla, Utah to Iron Springs Campground is 51 miles. There will be SCA signs posted at Main/Vernal Avenue inter-

Do your trees have more fruit than you can eat? Is your garden producing extra vegetables or herbs this year?

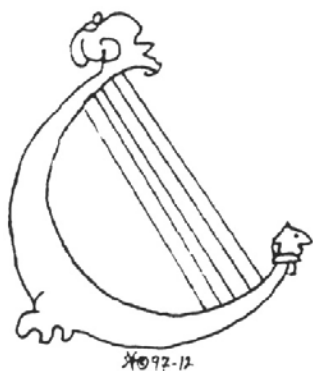

From the Cook's Corner

Even though the Cook's guild did not meet in June, due to Uprising, I went through our recipe files to find some recipes to share.

Pechonaya Ryba S Khrenom (Baked Fish with Horseradish)	
8 fish fillets (2 lbs)	1/2 teaspoon thyme
flounder or halibut	1/2 cup prepared horseradish
1/2 teaspoon salt	2 Tablespoons butter
Freshly ground pepper to taste	1/2 cup sour cream

Preheat the oven to 375 degrees. Grease an oven proof baking dish. Season the fish with salt, pepper, and thyme. Place four of the fillets in the baking dish. Spread half of the horseradish over them. Dot with half the butter. Spread on half the sour cream. Place the remaining four fillets on top and repeat the procedure, spreading on the remaining horseradish, butter and sour cream. Cover the dish and bake for 30 minutes. Remove the cover and continue baking for 15 minutes more or until fish is flaky. Makes 4 generous servings.

Raspberry Souffle`

1 pound raspberries (frozen raspberries, thawed, may be used)	4 eggs, separated
1/4 cup confectioner's sugar	1/2 cup superfine sugar
1 envelope unflavored gelatin	1 1/4 cups heavy cream
Mint sprigs to decorate	lightly whipped

Tie a greased sheet of wax paper around a 6-inch souffle` dish to form a collar above the rim. Reserve a few of the raspberries and sieve or puree the rest. Fold the superfine sugar into the puree. Soften the gelatin in a half a cup of cold water, then heat it over a pan of hot water until it has dissolved completely. Allow it to cool a little. Whisk the egg yolks and sugar together over the hot water. Fold in the raspberry puree and the gelatin and cool. Fold in half the cream. Whisk the egg whites until stiff, and fold into the mixture with a METAL spoon. Turn into the prepared souffle` dish and leave to set. When set, remove the collar carefully and decorate the souffle` with the remaining cream, raspberries, and mint sprigs.

Letters of Intent/Service Opportunities

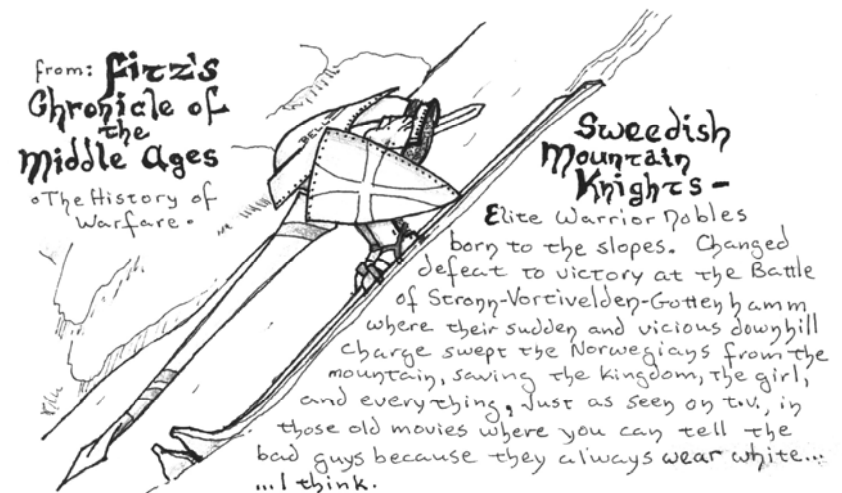
