


# Greetings unto the Populace of Joch Salann,.



Coronation will be held on July 14, 2001 at the Boise Senior Center at 690 Robbins Rd., Boise Id. Travel on Interstate 84 to the Broadway Avenue exit, #54. Go north on Broadway (toward the foothills) for 3.3 miles. When you cross Main St. get into the right lane. After you cross Jefferson St., the road will bend to the left. Stay in the right lane. June 7-10, 2001 Barony One Thousand Eyes Ririe, ID

Greetings unto all! Baron Uggedei Mighan Nidun and his lady Baroness Diedre of Kerry, are proud to host within the Barony of One Thousand Eyes Uprising Part XV, June 7-10, 2001 at beautiful Mountain River Ranch in Ririe, Idaho. Come and have fun, and join us in Uprising against boredom, mundanity and peace!

There will be fighting, bridge battles, butterfly chasing, rapier fighting, woods battles, rope jumping (in armor?), equestrian events, archery, and more! We are planning to set up four erics in the center of Town Square for tourneys. A Laurel's Prize Tourney and a Laurel's Bardic Prize Tourney are being planned, as well as a full slate of classes. For those moments between classes and battles, there will be merchants, lots and lots of merchants!

The site will open at noon on Thursday, June 7, 2001, and will close at noon on Sunday, June 10. The site fee is \$16.00 for those 13 years or older, and \$8.00 for ages 6-12, with \$2.00 off for members, and a maximum family price of \$45.00. Only above ground fire pits will be allowed, and there will be firewood for sale. NO PETS will be allowed. Horses will be allowed for the equestrian games, and the cost of stalls will be \$10.00 per day, excluding feed.

Classes offered this year include: Beginning and Advanced Needlepoint, Snood Making, Writing Shakespearean Sonnets, Metal Casting, Persona Development, Being an Officer, Patterning, Blacksmithing, Felting, Heraldry, Tour of the Stables, Blackwork, Middle Eastern Footwork, and MORE!

#### The directions to Uprising XV:

From the North, South, or West:

From I-15, find US 26 by taking Exit #119, US 20 West Yellowstone. Turn East on to US 20. After little less than 1 mile, take Science Center Drive Exit. Follow the Exit to the right, (Science Center Drive will become Anderson Dr.) and at the third light, turn Left onto Yellowstone Highway. There is a McDonalds on the right side of the Intersection. You are now on US 26 eastbound. At this point it is a little more than 17 miles to the next turn. Go through Idaho Falls and follow the road towards Jackson. Turn left off of US 26 at the sign for Mountain River Ranch, just after mile marker #352. Follow this road, and go straight at the 4-way stop. When the road forks, about 1 ½ miles from the stop sign, stay to the right. At about another mile you will see the large gate and sign for Mountain River Ranch. Turn right before the gate and take this dirt road about a half mile and the entrance will be on your right.

From the East:

Take US 26 through Swan Valley, go past the rest stop about 5 miles, and turn right off US 26 at the sign for Mountain River Ranch, just before mile marker #352. Follow directions above from Follow this road, and go straight at the 4-way stop. When the road forks, about 1 ½ miles from the stop sign, stay to the right. At about another mile you will see the large gate and sign for Mountain River Ranch. Turn right before the gate and take this dirt road about a half mile and the entrance will be on your right. THERE WILL BE SIGNS !!!

# **Joch Salann Melee Madness**June 2-3, 2001 Barony of Loch Salann Provo, UT

Over 19 years in one place, enjoyed by hundreds! My, how time flies! Yes, once again the annual Loch Salann Melee Madness event will occur June 2-3 at its ancient and honorable site at the castle in back of the Utah State Hospital in Provo, Utah. The site will officially **OPEN** by 8:00 a.m. on Sat., and **CLOSE** around sunset on Sunday; however, those who are camping onsite may set up Fri. night after 7:30 (check with the event steward). Opening announcements are tentatively planned for 10:30 a.m. on Sat. (or whenever HE Timmur and the event steward think that enough fighters have shown up). In keeping with sacred, honored and moss-covered tradition, the mood of the event will be laid-back and mellow. The rule of combat for the Saturday activities is no one-on-one battles; ie., all challenges must have a minimum of two fighters vs. one. With luck the staircase and ramp battles might be run a little differently this year (depending on the number of fighters present), but fighters are still strongly encouraged to create their own situations and complications. To get in the most fighting, the earlier the fighters begin fighting, the better (and cooler) it will be; take the hint. Sunday morning, there will be a pas d'armes held by HL Kyle and HL Isabeau; see him for details.

If you've ever wanted to run/sponsor and activity/contest (fighting or non-fighting) this is the place to do it; just clear it with the autocrat and appropriate coordinator. Even though this year's event will be a 2-day activity, participants are encouraged to come early, and bring picnic lunches and sunshades/tents (although there are numerous shade trees). This is a very dry site! Because this is a state facility, anyone bringing alcoholic beverages onsite or found to be in an inebriated condition will be politely asked to leave immediately! Merchants for provisions and gastronomic repasts are only 2-3 minutes away, and while open fires are not permitted, hibachis and gas grills are. Pets are welcome if accompanied by responsible owners. Cars can be unloaded at the field, but must be parked in the lot at the bottom of the hill (about 200 ft. away) immediately afterwards.

The SITE FEE is \$5.00 for adults and children 13 yrs. Old and older (babes in arms are free and pregnant ladies get a \$1 rebate); per **family** price cap of \$20 (<u>not</u> household!). Make checks payable to "Barony of Loch Salann, SCA Inc.". DIRECTIONS: Take I-15 to the <u>Provo</u> Center Street exit; drive east on Center St. (about 2 miles) and enter the hospital grounds. Continue east and turn left at the large planter in the road; follow the road around and up to the castle area (the "off limits" signs aren't meant for us).

P.S. bring your cameras, it's one of the area's most beautiful sites (sights?)

### Henry 99

(part two in a continuing genealogy of the Plantagenets)
By Fiona the Norseman's Daughter

Henry was born in 1133, the first of three sons of Geoffrey and Matilda. When Stephen died in 1154, he was welcomed as King by England's war weary nobility. He set about restoring the power of the king in a land where it had been greatly eroded, recovering for the crown land that had been lost to it under Stephen. He sponsored the invasion of Ireland in 1171 by Richard FitzGilbert de Clare, called Strongbow (yes, that's where all that trouble started!).

Henry had boundless energy and was in constant motion around his vast domains. He never lost his love of active outdoor pursuits such as hunting. He was tall, with broad shoulders and much strength and endurance; usually dressed informally. He was courteous and charming, with a good sense of humor but had the infamous Angevin temper and his rages were legendary. He was quick to take offense if his authority as king were threatened. He was a scholar, as well.

Henry's Queen, Eleanor of Aquitaine, one of the best known women of the middle ages, was one of the most vivid and remarkable figures of the time. Eleanor was portrayed in numerous Robin Hood movies of the 1940s and '50s as a sweet, slightly dumpy lady sitting, overlooking the archery field or protecting Maid Marion. This portrayal seems very unlike the picture of Eleanor that comes down through history Born in 1122, the eldest child and heiress of William X, Duke of Aquitaine, Eleanor was married in 1137 to Louis VII of France, who was a devout and pious man. Too devout and pious for Eleanor, who likened being married to him as being married to a monk, not a king, and was granted a divorce 21 March 1152. She had given her first husband only girls, Mary and Alice. She wasted no time marrying Henry. He was 19; she was about 30. Henry she gave five sons and three daughters—and some of the best-known personages in English history. When she turned against Henry later in life, he felt compelled to imprison her for sixteen years to keep her from tearing apart his kingdom.

Henry's love for his mistress Rosamund Clifford, "Fair Rosamund," may have been cause for his falling out with Eleanor. She can't be blamed for his conflicts with his sons, however. Henry provided grand titles to his oldest sons: Henry was set to get Normandy, Maine, and Anjou; Richard to get Aquitaine; and Geoffrey to get Brittany. Even John was titled "Lord of Ireland." But his sons, typical Angevin get, preferred power to title. Urged on by their mother, Eleanor, between 1172 and 1186 they rose in various combinations against their father. Hen-

ry tried to assure a peaceful succession by having his son Henry, called the Young King, crowned during his lifetime but young Henry died in 1182, before Henry II. In 1188, Richard was at war, with King Philip of France, with Henry. Already ill when he was defeated at Le Mans, Henry died on 6 July 1189, at Chinon, France.

- 3. Matilda, b. June 1156, d. 28 June 1189, m. Henry V, Duke of Saxony and Bavaria 1 February 1167/68. Parents of Emperor Otto IV.
- 4. Richard I, King of England, Lionheart, b. 13 September 1157, d. 6 April 1199 of gangrene caused by an arrow wound. M. Berengaria of Navarre May 1191. Richard had promised to marry Alice, sister of Philip of France. Before he could, however, his mother introduced him to Berengaria, daughter of the King of Navarre. Richard married her, instead.
- 5. Geoffrey, b. 23 September 1158, d. 19 September 1186. M. Constance Countess of Brittany. He had married Constance of Brittany and fathered a son, Arthur of Brittany, who had a claim to the throne. Arthur was taken prisoner by John's forces at Mirebeau, taken to Falaise, then to Rouen in 1203. He was never seen again and probably died at the hands, directly or indirectly, of John, who had always been threatened by the existence of the young man and his claim to the throne.

- Eleanor, b. 13 Oct 1162, d. 13 Oct 1214. M. Alfonso VII, King of Castile.
- 8. Joanna, b. October 1165, d. 4 September 1199. M. Raymond VI of Toulouse.

The foods we prepared were Barley Broth, Forfar Bridies, and Montrose Cakes. Yes, the Scottish DO eat more than Cock a Leekie and Haggis. These recipes were simple to prepare but wonderfully delicious. After an evening of jokes, puns, and much good food. the following recipe was chosen to share.

#### Montrose Cakes

2 cups flour
2 cups sugar
1 pound butter
1 dozen eggs
10 oz. currants (optional)
2 Tablespoons brandy
1 Tablespoon rosewater
2-3 teaspoons grated nutmeg

Cream together the butter and sugar. Add well beaten eggs in small degrees. Then slowly add the flour. Mix well. Add the currants, brandy, rosewater, and nutmeg. Beat all until well blended, about 15 minutes in a mixer. Place batter in small buttered tins (cupcake pans will do) filling them half way. Cook in a 350 degree oven for 20 to 25 minutes or until the tops have browned nicely. Eat as is or serve with cream.

Finally, there will be archery at Coronation! I am heading up the range to run the 2nd Artemisian Archery Championships, the prize being named "Protector of the Gryphon's Arrows" and a place on Their Majesties entourage. While I am keeping the actual championship tourney undisclosed at this time (partially because I have to make sure we have the range to ourselves that day) I will ask if anyone is interested in shooting a Royal Round that day as well (time permitting). We have a 3 hour window to shoot the Championship, but it should get done early enough that we can probably fit in a Royal Round as well. Anyone interested? The Championship shoot will be for both handbow and Crossbow entries, each with its own advantages/disadvantages. Speed will be a factor in the shoot, so keep this in mind when considering which bow to bring. Let me describe the archery range: It is a Boise Parks & Rec range, managed by the Treasure Valley Bowhunters Association. It is a very Nice range in a small basin about 1/4 mile from site. There is no shade (bring some!) but there are some picnic tables to lay equipment on, a port-a-john, a gravel shooting area, wood archery line, dirt with some scrub range, and the targets are compressed carpet with thick mats Around it (slightly sheltered) held on a metal frame. I have shot my crossbow at the targets, and the bolts don't sink all the way in, even without any paper or cardboard in front. There have been some cases of bounce back, but I hope to use some foamboard at Coronation to reduce that.
