

Upcoming Activities and Events

Melee Madness - June 2-3, 2018

Spring has sprung and Summer is a-comin' in! The lengthening days bring a song to our hearts and call us forth to MELEE MADNESS, June 2-3, at its Ancient and Honorable site at the Castle in back of the Utah State Hospital in Provo, Utah! Come roam the ramparts of the castle, storm the walls, defend the keep! Or just relax in the sun and visit with friends old and new!

It will be a day of martial joy as armored fighters, rapier warriors and combat archers battle their worthy adversaries in melee after melee! The Baronial Archery and Thrown Weapons



championships will be held, so sharpen your knives and axes and wax your bowstrings! Opening announcements will be at 10:00 am on Saturday (or whenever TRMs, TEs of Loch Salann and the Activity Steward thinks enough people have shown up). The earlier the fighters arrive, the more fun (and cooler) the fighting will be.

On Sunday, weather permitting, House Catwing and Hold Tyte will hold their annual Pas d'Armes, open to all armored fighters; see the Activity Steward for details. Bring your nicest fighting clothes and banners, and display your skill at weapons and words.

There will be Bardic classes, as well as activities for our youth (including youth combat!). If you've ever wanted to sponsor/run an activity, contest or teach a class (fighting or non-fighting) this is the place to do it; just clear it with the Activity Steward.

Though this a 2-day activity, the populace is encouraged to come early on Saturday and bring picnic lunches and sunshades/tents, although there are many shade trees on site. **This is a very dry site!** Because this is a state facility, anyone bringing alcoholic beverages onsite or found to be in an inebriated condition will be politely required to leave immediately! Ground fires or open flames are not permitted, but off-ground fire pits, hibachis and gas grills are allowed. Pets are welcome if accompanied by responsible owners. After unloading, please park your vehicle in either the parking lot at the bottom of the hill or up the hill near the stone privies.

Site: Utah State Hospital, 1300 E. Center St., Provo, UT. While the site will officially OPEN at 8:00am on Saturday and CLOSE at 10:00 pm on Sunday, we will be allowed to set up tents Friday afternoon after 5:30 pm. Unless told otherwise, camping will only be allowed on the field in front of the castle. If you plan to camp overnight, please contact the Activity Steward beforehand. Site fees: Donations are very welcome, to help defray costs. Make checks payable to "SCA Inc., Barony of Loch Salann"

Directions: Take I-15 to the Provo Center St. exit 267; drive east on Center St. (about 2 miles) and turn right into the hospital grounds. Continue east and turn left at the large planter in the road in front of the admin building; follow the road to the right up and around to the castle area (the "off limits" signs aren't meant for us).

Full York Shoot - June 9, 2018

Barony Arcuum has been asked to host an Activity, and we have chosen to put on a full York shoot. We will be holding this shoot at The Front Archery (Archery Tag Utah)

14932 S. Concorde Park Dr., Bluffdale, UT 84065

The cost for the shoot is \$7 per person.

A York consists of 24 ENDS

12 ends of 6 flights shot from 100 yards, 8 ends of 6 flights shot at 80 yards, and 4 ends of 6 flights shot at 60 yards.

The York is always shot in the following order: 100 yards, 80 yards, 60 yards.

A long range competition. The major round shot by longbowmen, which was developed by the Royal Kentish Bowmen. (Wales) 72 arrows (12 ends) at 100 yards, 48 (8 ends) at 80 yards, 24 (4 ends) at 60 yards, at a standard four-foot target, a 48" diameter target with 4 equal concentric rings around a center of gold.

Inner Gold = 10 points Outer Gold = 9 points Inner Red = 8 points Outer Red = 7 points Inner Blue = 6 points Outer Blue = 5 points Inner Black = 4 points Outer Black = 3 points Inner White = 2 points

Outer White = 1 points

The York is always shot in the following order: 100 yards,80 yards, 60 yards.

Our Society is built on the ideals of chivalry and courtesy, but runs by the concept of service. Without cooks, marshals, teachers, tent-raisers, hall-decorators, and so forth, no one would get to enjoy any of the activities we have come to know and love. The opportunities for service are practically limitless and the best part is, when everyone gives a little, nobody has to give a lot! Let us consider the types of service in the Society and learn about the reasons and rewards for serving.

"The SCA is not simply about what I get out of it; much more it is about what I put into it. To serve at an event, behind the scenes, or in my day to day interactions and by doing so to lift up others and honor their service is far more reward than any scroll I've ever received." -- Señor Santiago Ruiz de Zaragoza

There are two main types of service in the Society: group service and event service.

Group Service

As you begin to participate in the Society, you will quickly come to discover that the everyday, ongoing activities of the Society take planning, coordination, and execution by the members of its groups. Whether it be local fighter practices, business meetings, arts and sciences workshops, or any other gathering, someone usually has to organize it, plan it, run it, and clean up after it. By serving in your local group or for your kingdom, you help the Society to function on a daily basis.





The main individuals responsible for ensuring that the activities in any group are held are the officers. From the Seneschal who directs the business of the group, to the marshals who coordinate combat practices, to the herald who helps research names and devices, the officers of a local group or kingdom oversee and promote nearly every type of activity we do. Whereas many officers' activities put them out in front of fighters, classes, and crowds, many officers act behind the scenes, such as those who balance the books, organize and file event paperwork, and sort heraldic submissions. There are many opportunities to serve from the comfort of your computer desk, leaving you free to relax at local events (or serve there, too).

In addition to serving as an officer, you can also serve by helping out at workshops, teaching classes, participating in demos, or assisting the group or individuals with projects. The best way to find out what opportunities for service exist is by attending the activities of the local group.

Ask a SCAdian: What's the best way to start with service in my local group?

"The easiest way is by offering up ideas when the group is planning an event as it

often helps the group think outside of the box or get out of a rut. You can also help with the loading and unloading for an event. Help is always needed and you get to know more local folks. There are also demos and educational activities, parades, etc. where you can start out as a learner yourself and also help fill out the ranks. Becoming a deputy to an office you are interested in is also a great way to get to know the ins and outs of a group. It is never too early to start volunteering. The group will have more opportunities to get to know you the more you ask if you can help." -- Bantiarna Muirenn ingen Donngaile

Event Service

As the ongoing activities of the Society are maintained through its local groups and kingdoms, one of the most important parts of our organization are its events. Without a doubt, this weekend some group somewhere is hosting an event, probably in your kingdom, and possibly right down the road. Most local groups host anywhere from one to three events each year, so there may be a hundred or more opportunities to attend and serve at an event in your kingdom.

For as many opportunities are there are to serve in your local group, there are that many more positions that need to be filled at any given event. For example, the average small armored combat tournament needs at least one marshal, one list master, one field herald, one person to run cards between the list table and the heralds, not to mention a handful of people to set up the field. If there are additional needs such as multiple fields fighting simultaneously, a large number of entrants, or a large list field to cover, the need for volunteers may double or triple. It may take ten or fifteen people working together to run one tournament, and this is



only one of the activities that may be taking place at any given event!

No matter what your experience level, there are plenty of areas to serve at an event. Feasts need cooks, servers, and dishwashers. Collegiums need teachers and coordinators. Whether you give an hour or a whole weekend, even the smallest amount of volunteer time can make a huge difference in both the stress level of the event staff and the enjoyment of the attendees.

You do not have to be a member of the group hosting the event in order to serve. Check with the relevant officer or event staff member to see if they will need help. If you like to help out in the kitchen, contact the head cook. If you like to herald the field, drop by the list table and ask for the lead voice herald. If you see someone setting up a pavilion, offer a helping hand. The worst thing that can happen is to be told they already have enough volunteers and that's not such a bad thing to have at all!

Why Do We Serve?

Service in the Society is a means to an end. Without someone running the tournament, there is no tournament. Without someone registering names, nobody gets a unique name. Without someone cooking the feast, nobody gets to eat. By volunteering at local events, you make it so that others can come and fight, feast, and have a good time. Then, when it's your turn, you'll hopefully find those others in their own kitchen or marshalling their own field so that you can play, too.

Ask a SCAdian: How important is it that I find a way to get involved?

"Being involved is probably the most important part of being in the Society. Our groups is based on volunteering and being part of the group, whether it's helping run events, making things, cooking, fighting or listening to stories. The main aspect that sets us apart from Renaissance Faires -- which many of us enjoy -- is that we are always participants, not just spectators. We make the magic happen." -- Master Liam St. Liam

That said, there are also substantive benefits to providing service in the Society. Every kingdom in the Society has a series of awards and orders designed to recognize those who participate in their realm, either through arts and sciences, through martial activities, through service, or by other means. By that token, every kingdom has specific awards that recognize acts of service to local groups or to the kingdom at large. Many of these awards increase your rank or precedence within the kingdom, and some come with special titles and regalia.

Should the "end" of our means of service be recognition with an award? Generally, no. While aspiring to be recognized by your fellow Society members and your kingdom's Crown is never a bad thing, serving only for the sake of getting an award will generally leave you anxious or disappointed. In the Society, service is more about providing for the needs of the group or the event to ensure success and the feeling of accomplishment that comes from a job well done. Getting an award always feels good, but knowing a hundred people had fun because of how you helped out feels even better. If you serve faithfully and consistently for twenty years, will you rack up the medals and tokens? Perhaps, perhaps not. But in that time, what else will you have accomplished?



You will have helped countless events run smoothly, aided newcomers in learning and growing within the Society, ensured the success and longevity of your local group, and earned the esteem of your fellows who see the sweat of your brow and appreciate all that you have done. Serve from a heart of dedication and from a sense of duty to your local group and kingdom and you will never find yourself unfulfilled.

In honor of said event on Antelope Island, where we all enjoyed the "hospitality" of the "locals," I wrote this short poem:


The Hatching of an Army

Greetings from the Needleworkers Guild

In attendance were 6 ladies, including myself. We were pleased to have Mistress Helovs de Bec visiting with us. She was doing the quilting on a pieced quilt that she made quite some time ago. It is a sampler quilt that has quite a variety of different piece quilt designs. I have never seen anyone do quilting in a hoop on their lap instead of a giant quilt frame, so that was very interesting to me. Mistress Bengta joined us as well. She is going to redesign the trim on one of her dresses, so she was in the process of removing the existing trim. Also joining us was a new comer to the SCA, m'lady Raine. Because she is renewing her interest in embroidery and hasn't stitched for while, she was given a piece of zenbroidery from a previous give away so that she could practice stitches. She also went home with fabric for a couple of neck coolers. We hope to see more of her in the future.

As a group, we discussed doing another 100 day challenge. Rules will be similar to last year with the following changes: Only decorative embroidery will be counted, in other words, it must be seen from the outside of the item/garment. I won't be counting hand stitched seams on dresses, quilts, etc. I will be counting decorative stitching as is often seen on the outside of seams for Viking apron dresses as these are decorative in nature. At least one item must be completed within the designated time frame, this would include those items for the guild largesse projects as well as personal projects. The start date is May 1, end date is guild meeting on September 4th. Starting early allows plenty of days off. Minimum embroidery time, 30 minutes per day, multiple days cannot be combined into one. Reporting will be like last year, use facebook and list hours worked per day, posting must occur at least once per week and should include a photo showing the status of your work . List individual days separately. Everyone who completes the challenge will earn a prize, I have not decided yet what the prizes will be and/or if they will be different or the same. I am considering additional prizes for the following: total hours work and total number of largesse items completed within the designated time frame. So keep that in mind as you work. Final decisions will be posted soon as well as a full listing of the rules.




