

After 36 Years (more or less) The Ramp of Despair is still giggling at you! The Staircase of Doom continues to give you the finger behind your back! Come help us celebrate yet another Loch Salann Melee Madness!! This unique & ancient event will occur o n June 1st & 2nd 2019, at its equally unique, incredibly ancient and honorable site at the castle in back of the Utah State Hospital in Provo, Utah. Fighting, archery, thrown weapons, relaxing in the sun – what more could you want? Come on out! Join the crowd! Enjoy the day! Opening announcements are tentatively planned for 10:00 am on Saturday (or whenever the event steward thinks that enough fighters have shown up).

The more fighters we have, the more fun the castle siege scenarios will be!! While all this is going on, the competitions for Baronial archery and thrown weapons champions will also be taking place. On Sunday morning, weather allowing, House Catwing & Hold Tyte will hold their annual pas d'armes, open to all fighters; see the event steward for details. Bring your nicest banners and fighting clothes, and display your skills at weapons and words.

If you ever wanted to run/sponsor an activity/contest or teach (fighting or non-fighting), this is the place to do it; just clear it with the event steward and appropriate coordinator.

While the site will officially OPEN by 8:00 am on Saturday, and CLOSE at 10:00 pm on Sunday, we will be allowed to set up tents Friday night after 5:30 pm. Unless told otherwise, camping is only allowed this year on the field in front of the castle; please contact the event steward beforehand if you plan on camping overnight.

Even though this will be a 2-day activity, participants are encouraged to come early and bring picnic lunches and sunshades/tents (although there are numerous shade trees). This is a very dry site! Because this is a state facility, anyone bringing alcoholic beverages onsite or found to be in an inebriated condition must be politely asked to leave immediately! Off-site merchants are only 4-6 minutes away, and while ground fires or open flames are not permitted, off-ground fire pits, hibachis and gas grills are.

I was inspired by the Persona Pentathlons held in other kingdoms to create a slightly smaller challenge for our competition. I will provide a handmade token to each person who chooses to take on this additional challenge and completes it.

## In order to meet the challenge you must:

- Enter three items from three of the categories below. (Or five if you want to take the full Persona Pentathlon challenge! You only need to enter three to fulfill my challenge, but if you're an overachiever you should definitely do you boo!). If you have any questions about which category an item belongs in please contact me.
- There can be no overlap of categories (ie. an embroidered coif that is entered as both category 1 and

category 5). It must be three separate items.

- Provide documentation for each item you present.
- Present the items in the Baronial Arts and Sciences competition or Artisans Display at Defenders Tourney in A.S. LIV (2020).
- You do not need to be a member of the Barony to participate in the challenge or to enter Arts and Sciences, but only a member of the Barony may become Baronial Champion or Defender.

Category 1: Garb/fiber arts/fabric decoration (clothing, embroidery, weaving, lace making, etc)

Category 2: Food/drink (cooked, brewed, smoked, aged. Anything you can eat or drink)

Category 3: Tools/implements (could include tools for making things, musical instruments, dishes, utensils, etc)

**Category 4:** Performance/fine arts (carving, performing, writing, painting, etc)

## Fresh Fruit Compote & A Brief Timeline of Fruit

In celebration of Spring, Lady Alix D'Orleans has shared another delicious recipe, and some just as satisfying history on the history of fruit!

This recipe was a simple way people ate their fruits. In the last section is a partial timeline of fruits from the earliest known history through about 1700. Compotes can be made from any fruit (the reason for the different images). There is also one bit of note I also thought the readers might find interesting.

# Fresh Fruit Compote Ingredients

- 1 cup sugar
- 2 tart apples
- 3 plums
- 2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice (DO NOT use bottled juice)
- 1 cup currants or raisins (if you use raisins I suggest the golden variety for appearances)
- 4 cups water
- 2 peaches
- 1 cup fresh strawberries
- 2 to 3 cinnamon sticks
- ½ cup of slivered or sliced almonds (for garnish)

#### **Directions:**

- 1) Add the sugar to the water in a large pot. Heat to boiling.
- 2) Wash, pare, quarter, core, and slice the apples and peaches into ½ inch thickness. Put in a bowl and set aside
- 3) Wash and clean the plums and strawberries. Cut into ¼ inch pieces and add to the bowl of apples and peaches.
- 4) Add fruit, lemon juice, almond extract, and spices to the syrup.
- 5) Heat the mixture on a medium heat until it simmers.
- 6) Simmer for about 10 minutes. Pour into individual serving containers.
- 7) Refrigerate until cool.
- 8) Serve chilled and garnished with a few slivered or sliced almonds





## Fresh Fruit Compote & A Brief Timeline of Fruit

#### Fruit

Some people have shown an interest in my articles that have also mentioned the history of some foods. Three really good websites are:

Here are some of the mentions of fruit on that website:

**35,000 BC** Fruits, nuts, roots were being gathered for food but there has been no evidence of cultivation.

**11,000 BC** Figs trees may have been domesticated. Dried figs found in the lower Jordan Valley in Israel (2006) have been dated to about 11,400 BC. They are a variety that is sterile, so the people may have learned to cultivate new trees by planting shoots.

7,000 BC Apples possibly cultivated in southwestern Asia.

**6,000 BC** Citrus fruit ancestor (citron) may have been grown in India at this time.

**4,000 BC** Grapes were probably being cultivated in the area southeast of the Black Sea (Afghanistan, etc.)

**3,500 BC** Based on excavations of the Early Bronze Age, it is believed that the pomegranate was one of the first cultivated fruits.





## Fresh Fruit Compote & A Brief Timeline of Fruit

3,000 BC Egyptian tomb paintings picture fish ponds and fruit trees.

**2,000 BC** Olives, peaches and apricots cultivated in Eastern Mediterranean.

**1,600 BC** The pomegranate was brought to Egypt from Syria during the rule of the Hyksos.

**1,325 BC** Tutankhamen tomb contained seeds and plant products including watermelon, lentils, almond, date palm, cumin and coriander.

957 BC Pillars in Solomon's temple in Jerusalem were decorated with pomegranates.

**255 BC** The term 'don't upset the apple cart' was first used by Roman playwright Plautus in 255 B.C. in his play 'Epiducus'.

**125 BC** Pomegranates were introduced to China.

**1521** Spanish missionaries planted the first pomegranate trees in the New World. From Mexico, the pomegranate was transported north to missions in California and Texas.

**1553** Prospero Alpini was born and he is said to have introduced coffee and bananas to Europe and to have been the first to artificially fertilize date palms.

**1600** The blood orange is believed to have developed by natural mutation in Sicily.





## Fresh Fruit Compote & A Brief Timeline of Fruit

1633 Bananas were supposedly displayed in the shop window of merchant Thomas Johnson. This was the first time the banana had ever been seen in Great Britain. It would be more than 200 years before they were regularly imported. In 1999 remains of a banana were found at a Tudor archaeological site on the banks of the Thames River. This would seem to date it 150 years earlier than Thomas Johnson's banana. A classic food mystery!

**1659** Jan van Riebeeck, the first governor of the Cape of Good Hope, South Africa, planted a vineyard in 1655. On February 2, 1659 he made the first wine from grapes grown at the Cape.

#### **Additional Notes On Fruit**

Cranberries, Concord Grapes and Blueberries are the only major fruits native to North America.
